- 4.Private FDRs

2 MEDIATION

A trained mediator helps you reach agreement.

Benefits:

- 1.Faster
- 2.Less expensive
- 3.Private
- 4.Child-focused

Not suitable where:

- 1. Abuse is present
- 2.Urgency is required
- 3.One party refuses disclosure



03 arbitration

A private judge makes a binding decision. Fast, expert-driven, confidential. Ideal for:

- 1. Financial disputes
- 2. Specific issues
- 3. Urgent decisions

PRIVATE FDR (FINANCIAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION)

A senior lawyer or retired judge gives an indication, helping couples settle. Advantages:

- 1.Expertise
- 2.Speed
- 3. Predictability

COLLABORATIVE LAW

Solicitors work together to reach agreement, avoiding court.


